⁶VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX MINISTRY

The time to file 2017 taxes will soon be upon us. We at BSBC are continuing to minister to people in our downtown core in a meaningful and practical way through hosting a tax return clinic. BSBC has again been invited to be part of the "Community Volunteer Income Tax Program" (CVITP) to prepare income tax returns free of charge for seniors, students and low income individuals.

The number of tax returns prepared by BSBC volunteers in 2017 was just over 600! While completing a large number of returns is nice, the program is not and should never become just a numbers game. We are part of a larger city-wide effort that includes the Salvation Army and Forest Hill United Church who also host clinics. This ministry continues to meet a need in the community. We in turn are blessed through making new friendships, and renewing old ones.

How can you help?

We are always on the look for people who are interested in helping with preparing tax returns AND we also need one to two people at each clinic to act as greeters.

The basic requirement is only a willingness to help others who could use our assistance. If you have basic computer skills, you can easily learn how to prepare the computerized returns. Any volunteers who may not be comfortable using a computer would be able to help in a host/greeter role.

What do you need?

You DO NOT have to have your own computer. Canada Revenue Agency provided the computers and software. You just need a willingness to serve. You do not have to be available for all of the days or even all of the hours on a given day. Experience shows that we are busiest during the first hours and then things are a little more quiet the last hour or two.

REFUGEE OPPORTUNITY – We have been contacted by the Canadian Baptists of Atlantic Canada (CBAC) about a refugee opportunity. Perth Andover Baptist Church has completed their year of sponsorship with a Syrian family and the family has since moved to Fredericton to focus on English so that the husband can enroll in NBCC next year. Before the family left Perth Andover, the church agreed to bring their relatives through a full private sponsorship; however, it is expected that the relatives would prefer to settle in Fredericton. Thus, Perth Andover Baptist will need local assistance for the day-to-day support, setting up bank accounts, application for SIN, Medicare, etc. The family of six consists of the parents of the husband currently in Fredericton, as well as his brother, sister-in-law and their two school-aged children. Their arrival is scheduled for spring/summer. The Social Action Team doesn't have the resources at this time to commit to this large endeavour; but if you can commit to four to six hours a week for the next year, perhaps we, as a church, can assist! Please note that CBAC has only asked for our time – the funds are expected to be in place for this family!
